Dear parents/carers and pupils,

On Monday 17th March 2021, there will be a further lifting of the lockdown. I don't know about you but I am certainly looking forward to being able to enjoy more of these freedoms. But how does this apply to schools? Much has been made of the lifting of the face covering

restriction in secondary schools but has much changed in primary schools?
I am afraid there is not much to report. Primary school pupils are not, and never have been, required to wear face coverings in schools. Staff have. It is still recommended (but not insisted upon) that staff wear face coverings in communal areas where social distancing is not possible but not in classrooms. The local authority have been very clear that they still want parents at all Barking and Dagenham primary schools to wear face coverings when gathering at the school gates (unless exempt) and the staff will continue to wear these as well. Primary schools have been advised that we can reduce but not cancel our staggered starts. The introduction of the park gate meant we were in a position to do this some months ago however we do now require all children to be in school by 9am. Gates will continue to open at 8:45am and currently, there are no plans to change our collection arrangements.

School trips are allowed to commence but the school will be slow and cautious in our plans to return to these. We can invite our new Year Three cohort into the school for a transition day providing we have COVID safe protocols and the leadership team will be making plans around this shortly. There is more flexibility in terms of pupils mixing hence we will allow some more mixing indoors within year groups.

Following on from my messages about safety last week (and this week), I'm pleased to inform you that the bollards by our Ford Road entrance will be in use again each morning between 8:45am and 9:15am.

Finally, we have been looking at our procedures with regards to medication in school. This table summarises our position:

Do's Don'ts

- Hand all prescribed medications into the office.
- Complete a Medication Form.
- Clearly label ALL medication with your child's name and class.
- Ensure any emergency medication that your child requires is on site and in date (epi-pen, asthma pump).
- DO NOT Allow your child to keep medication on their person during the school day.
- DO NOT send your child to school with unprescribed medication.

This week Carn in 6L reports on the current Year 6 DT 'Bird House Builders' project.



Year Five

In Maths, we are working on adding and subtracting wholes and decimals; sequencing decimals and multiplying and dividing decimals by 10, 100 and 1000. In RE, we have begun our new topic of the Gospels and the children have been finding out all about what the gospels are and how they are a foundation for life for Christians. The children

This week in maths, the students have started a unit of work on angles. They have practised using a protractor to both measure and draw angles precisely. They have started to think about directions and the size of quarter, half and full turns and have transferred this knowledge to the use of a compass. In English the children have written poems that have influenced by the short story "The Nightmare Man" by Pie Corbett. They have thought carefully about the figurative language they have chosen. In their continued unit on God in RE, the pupils have read the story of Daniel and

Lion's Den and have looked at what

They have then drawn symbolic pictures to represent characteristics of Science has seen the children continuing their work on classification, creating their own classification keys.
