Dear parents and carers,

Welcome back! I hope you have enjoyed a fantastic holiday and are ready for the new school year ahead. A huge welcome to our new Year Three families too – it has been lovely to greet you each morning as you arrive at the school. I am also delighted that we are now able to operate with minimal COVID measures. Having two gates and one entrance time is working extremely well and it also lovely to welcome parents into the

playground at the end of the school day which is ensuring a much safer exit from the school. However, with these new arrangements, please be aware of the following important information:

- We are only allowing parents into the playground at the end of the school day. If you need to pass a message to the teacher, please phone or visit the office. If you do wish to speak to the teacher at the end of the day and do not have an appointment, please wait until all the children have been dismissed and be aware that teachers may have other meetings booked for after school.
- Please note no dogs/animals are permitted on the school site except guide dogs.
- Children and adults should push scooters and bikes on the playground instead of riding them.
- Children are your responsibility from the moment they leave the classroom into your care.
- If your child is to walk home alone or meet you elsewhere, permission needs to be given
  via the office or completing an online form on our website. Pupils are no longer our
  responsibility once they have left the classroom if they have permission to meet
  you elsewhere so please do ensure they know what to do if you are delayed
  (e.g. return to school).

Please wait away from the classroom at the end of the day in order that the
teacher can finish their lesson and dismiss the class safely without distraction.
 Having said all of that, I do feel our new collection arrangement is much quicker
and safer although I would value your feedback.

Sadly, the summer holiday has been a challenging time for the school with us experiencing two episodes of flooding and a significant about of staff sickness. As a result, a lot of exciting work around the school has sadly had to be delayed whilst these issues are managed hence the school site is still to experience some significant changes. We hope soon to have much more plant life outside, complete the exterior decoration of the building and also install some canopies for shelter in the playground. Work will also begin on installing a brand-new rood for the school which will result in scaffolding and some minor disruption in and around the school. Our school hall is still currently out of use but I do hope this will be resolved within the next two weeks. A huge thank you to Mr. Young for all his hard work in managing various builders and contractors who have been involved in ensuring we could reopen the school in September.

Unfortunately, we still have members of staff unwell at this time which is leaving us short staffed in areas outside of teaching. These members of staff would appreciate your thoughts and prayers and I thank you for your patience during those times where we cannot respond to your requests as quickly as we would like.


It's been great seeing so many children at the different after school clubs this week!
