This week every class in our school has given extra attention to the vitally important topic of eSafety as part of our Safer Internet Day. We focused on gaming and our pupils were so excited to learn about how to be safe when trying to enjoy this pastime that many of them clearly love. Many pupils also shared negative they experiences they have had such as receiving nasty messages or seeing unpleasant content, and gave advice of what to do to help their classmates. This week Year Five have celebrated 'Baghdad Day.' The children read about the six big


