We have analysed the meaning of the poem and the children have planned their own version of the poem based upon the structure of the original. Next week we will use our planning to create our finished poem. In science we have been learning about the digestive system and

about the pros and cons of seasonal food and then planned a seasonal sandwich. They really enjoyed making the sandwich and they also enjoyed eating them too! This week in maths, the children have been learning how maths can help them in later life. They have been learning how to calculate tax on yearly earnings and how to work out how much pay


given salaries would take home each month. They have worked hard follow the procedures and have been interested to find how
