What a week we have had in Year 3! They seem to have packed a lot of learning into such a short time! In Maths, we have now finished our unit on place value and have a new unit-addition subtraction. So far, the children have been using their number bonds and adding single digits but next week they will progress onto adding tens and hundreds as well as looking for patterns. In English the children have been learning about writing in the past progressive tense in readiness to use it in their stories. The children have also explored the features of an adventure story and have collected some ideas to use in their own stories which they will be writing

next week. In Science the children carried out an investigation to test the relative strengths of some magnets. The results were intriguing. Next week the children will



be putting their knowledge of magnets to a practical use- you will discover more about this next week. The highlight of the week for 3P was their visit to Pizza Express in Upminster. They thoroughly enjoyed making and eating the pizzas as did all the accompanying adults who made sure they included plenty of toppings. We hope you have a restful and peaceful weekend and we are looking forward to meeting you at parents' evenings next week.

Year Four

This week in maths, the children have been learning how to complete column subtraction involving exchanging. Once they got to grips with this method of

subtraction, they were introduced to the good work! Thank you too, to other efficient methods of subtraction which they were encouraged to choose from depending on the calculations set. In English this week, the children have worked hard on their half term assessment where they planned, wrote and then edited their own adventure The Year Four teachers were impressed with the effort that the children put into their stories and have enjoyed reading them. In our art lesson this week, the children have made Christmas cards but don't worry we haven't started the countdown to Christmas in October! We have asked the children to design and make a Christmas card this early as their designs will be sent off to be developed. The children's designs have also been entered into a competition to win a voucher for a local trampoline park. We would like to let you know that during November we will be holding a special off-curriculum day based on our study of India in geography and Hinduism in R.E. Many of the children enjoy dressing up in Indian style clothing during this day. We will send out an email next week with more details so that families can start thinking about clothing options over the half term.

Year Five

As we come towards the conclusion of our book 'Hidden Figures', the children in Year 5 have been demonstrating the skills they have learnt this half term in grammar as they complete and edit their biographies. In Maths, we have been finding

multiples and factors of numbers, which involved has using their



knowledge of multiplication tables. Well done to all those children who have been busy practicing them using Times Tables Rockstars at home to increase both speed and accuracy of recall - keep up everyone at home who is encouraging them. In P.E. we are making the most of the weather at the moment to get outside for hockey lessons before half term. Likewise, we are all pleased to have completed the part of our science involving shadows and sun dials before we lose the bright, sunny days. In PSHE we have shared our ideas about our rights, responsibilities, rewards and consequences at school, resulting in many interesting conversations and discussions in our groups. Next week, our final Year 5 class will be visiting The Museum of London and St. Paul's Cathedral as part of our Art and Design topic looking at architecture.

Year Six

In maths, it's been all hands-on deck with division, the children have learnt how to divide using factors, learnt two different techniques to do long division. Next week we will do look at multi-step problems, order of operations and calculations and estimations. In English, the children have recapped how and when to use casual conjunction and have started building up their arguments for their big write next week when they will write a balanced argument on whether
