We were also treated to a phenomenal Christmas dinner from our wonderful catering staff in the final week of term. A fantastic end to a very long term.



Year Three

Happy New Year to all our parents.

It has been lovely to welcome our year threes back this week. We hope you all had a lovely Christmas and New Year celebrations and enjoyed spending time with your children. We have heard tales of all the fun things which children got up to during their holiday from school.

We have already started a new topic in English based on the exciting story 'Around the World in Eighty Days'. You will find out a lot more about this over the coming weeks. This week the children have been exploring the features of nonchronological reports. They have also learned about proper nouns and using the present tense. Next week they will start preparing their own reports.

In maths we are continuing to learn about multiplication and the children have focused on the 2,3,5 and 10 times tables. Next week we will be focusing on the 4- and 8-times tables. In RE the children are now learning about Judaism. This week we looked at some Jewish artefacts and discussed some of the key features of the religion. Next week we will be studying the origins of Judaism in the story of Abraham. In History the children were learning about Egyptian leisure activities they used pictures to give them an idea of some of the fun things Egyptians got up to and then wrote about the picture including how it compares to a modern-day activity.

Year Four

We have been very excited to welcome back the children for the first week of 2023 and we have, as always, had an action-packed week! In English and reading, pupils have been introduced to their new theme and reading text: George's Marvellous Medicine. This fun-

filled inspired our first week's activities around poetry, where pupils have learnt how to use alliteration. onomatopoeia

how to use rhyming couplets when writing poetry. Pupils ending the week by writing their own poem, based around the ingredients for their very own marvellous medicine. In maths, pupils have continued their topic multiplication, looking specifically at factors and multiplying by 10As well as this, pupils began their topic of Europe, in Geography, where they began to look at continents.

Year Five



Year 5 have made a wonderful start to the New Year and all are settling nicely into their

new classes. As well as welcoming new members to our classes, we have also begun some new topics this week. Our maths topic for the next few weeks involves multiplication and division skills, so all the hard work Year 5 have been putting into learning their tables and TT Rockstars will be paying off. We have started reading our new shared reading book - 'Beowulf' - which links in with our history topic about the Anglo -Saxons. This week we have been thinking about the Anglo-Saxon views on justice and how it differed from our modern justice system in the United Kingdom. We have acted as juries to consider how crimes would have been dealt with both then and now. You might like to ask your children what they thought about the 'trials by ordeal'! 5A and half of 5H have commenced swimming sessions as part of our Physical Education curriculum and all classes will be learning the skills of football this term. Our science topic about forces commenced with what the

children could remember from their studies in previous years and then we constructed a city to begin our thinking about how you can get people in without a working transport system. The children can explain to you next week how are considering solving the problem! In English we have learnt about how and why hyphens are used and then incorporated them into planning and writing our own kennings. If you are not sure what a kenning is, Year 5 should be able to enlighten you this weekend!

Year Six

Well, Year 6 have hit the ground running this week! This week English, children have been introduced to new book that the



unit will be based on, When the Mountains Roared by Jess Butterworth. After reading the exciting flash forward, the children scoured it to find the descriptive language used by the author to set the scene. In RE this week, the children explored an excerpt from Matthew 21 v 1-11 about the journey taken by Jesus to fulfil Zechariah's prophecy. They then recreated that journey by produced their storyboard. We have begun a fantastic new art unit on photography this week. The children used their observation skills to try to see what different photographs tell us about people. The children then had the opportunity to use the iPads to take photos of their own space in school to try to tell a story about themselves. In science, children investigated periscopes worked. They were able to make their own periscopes, using cereal boxes and mirrors and they used these to help them write an explanation. Next week we will be giving the children the chance to write letters to children from a school in Germany who would like to practise their English skills by becoming
