Our first session began with a healthy competition - building a stable bridge using only 3 pieces of card. Can you believe that Okigbo, Robert and Chidimma built a bridge which took 1.6kg of weight! Swimming is going swimmingly (excuse the pun!) and we have noticed the children making great progress and their confidence in the water is improving.

Year Six

This week Year 6 have been exploring characters emotions in English, after reading the first couple of chapters of *When the Mountains Roared*, children considered how Ruby the main character is feeling based on events. Children wrote fantastic diary entries from the perspective of Ruby, explored descriptive language and learnt how to use colon and semicolons. In maths this week, the

children learnt how to find percentage of amounts, so it would be great to get them solving all your calculations next time you go to a sale. Next week we will be finishing the unit and



moving onto decimals. In RE this week, the children explored how Christians express their beliefs about Jesus, writing their own recipes on how to be great peacemakers like Owen Thomas and Desmond Tutu. In science, the children discussed things they already knew about the human body and where different organs were placed in the body.

Year Three

Where does time go? This last week has flown by and your lovely children have worked so hard this week. A lot of the children have been participating in Times

improving their speed the more they practise. This is really going to help them with their maths work in class so please encourage them to continue practising. In English this week we continued to read 'Around the World in Eighty Days'. The children have practised using subordinating conjunctions and have researched a country. They have also practised writing and answering their own questions. Next week they will be carrying out further research on one of the countries which Phineas Fogg visited. In History this week the children learned about Egyptian gods. They played a fun game where they had to match statements to the correct deity and wrote about one of the deities they had studied. In RE the children had the opportunity to look at and find out about the Jewish holy book the Torah. They were really interested to see how it was written in the form of a scroll. The children participated in a special workshop this week run by The Institute of Imagination. The children made exciting and creative sculptures based on the theme of 'balance'. Some of their creations were truly wonderful. Next Friday is also our special Egypt day so please remember to send your children to school in their Egyptian outfits.

Year Four

This week in Year Four, the children have started to work on instructional writing.

They examined the features instructions and then worked with a partner to write a guide for a new pupil entering Year Four. The children also acted out some of their instructions and it made them realise how precise instructional writing must be. In maths, the children have been learning how to multiply and divide by 10 and 100. This week, geography involved the children developing their mapwork skills by using an atlas to identify the countries of Europe. In history, the children have continued their learning of why there was a move away from stone to bronze and the benefits this had for the people of this time. Our week began with an exciting afternoon of PSHE and creative

learning through a nationwide online lesson led by the Institute of Imagination. On Wednesday morning, we were also lucky enough to participate

enough to participate in a nationwide webinar that explained the huge variety of career choices offered by the NHS.

Year Five

We have had a jam-packed week here in Year 5. In English, we continued reading and analysing the narrative 'Beowulf'. As the anticipated fight between Beowulf and Grendel approaches, the children have been summarising what they have read so far and have produced some excellent role-playing scenes to show understanding. The children their independently retrieved and recorded research on the history of Beowulf and where the story originated - they couldn't believe the original manuscript can be found in the British Library. We have continued long multiplication in maths this week with increasing difficulty - the children have learnt many strategies to tackle such problems and are becoming more accurate.
