When prefixes are added to a root word we may need to use a hyphen. If the prefix ends in a vowel and the root word begins with a vowel a hyphen is often used. <i>Exceptions: react &amp; coincidence.</i>		The ‘i before e except after c’ rule applies to words where the sound spelt by ei is /i:/. Exceptions: protein, caffeine, seize (and either and neither if pronounced with an initial /i:/ sound).		The letter string ‘ough’ can be used to spell several different sounds. Ough can sound like or in certain words.	No specific rule – revisit challenging rules from the ½ term.
