Spelling Rule	No rule – children to be exposed to topic words for the ½ term	-able is a suffix added if a complete root word can be heard before it. E.G. dependable -ible is a suffix added when there is no complete root word. E.G. possible If the root words end in y – then it becomes i before the suffix. E.G. rely/ reliable Exception – enjoy/enjoyable If the root words end in e then the e is removed before adding –able. E.G. admire/admirable. However if the root word ends in –ce, -ge then the e is kept. E.G. change/changeable.	-ably is a suffix added if a complete root word can be heard before it. E.G. dependably -ibly is a suffix added when there is no complete root word. E.G. possibly If the root words end in e then the e is removed before adding –able. E.G. admire/admirably. When the ending –ible is added to words ending with –e, -ce, or –ge, the e is removed. E.G. force/forcibly.
